
### WORKSHOP FOR TEACHERS:



#### रामधारी सिंह 'दिनकर

रामधारी सिंह 'दिनकर' (23 सितंबर 1908 – 24 अप्रैल 1974) हिंदी साहित्य के एक प्रमुख कवि, लेखक और विचारक थे, जिन्हें 'राष्ट्रकिव' की उपाधि से सम्मानित किया गया। उनका जन्म बिहार के बेगूसराय जिले के सिमरिया गाँव में हुआ था। दिनकर जी ने पटना विश्वविद्यालय से इतिहास में स्नातक किया और शिक्षक, सरकारी अधिकारी, विश्वविद्यालय कुलपित तथा राज्यसभा सदस्य के रूप में अपनी सेवाएँ दीं।

उनकी काव्य-शैली में ओज, वीर रस और राष्ट्रभक्ति की प्रधानता थी। उनकी प्रमुख रचनाएँ — 'कुरुक्षेत्र', 'रश्मिरथी', 'उर्वशी', 'हुंकार' और 'संस्कृति के चार अध्याय' — हिंदी साहित्य की अमूल्य धरोहर हैं। 'उर्वशी' के लिए उन्हें ज्ञान पीठ पुरस्कार और 'संस्कृति के चार अध्याय' के लिए साहित्य अकादमी पुरस्कार से सम्मानित किया गया।

दिनकर जी की कविताएँ स्वतंत्रता संग्राम के दौरान जन-जागरण का माध्यम बनीं। उनकी पंक्तियाँ — "सिंहासन खाली करो कि जनता आती है"

और

"क्षमा शोभती उस भुजंग को, जिसके पास गरल हो"

आज भी युवाओं को प्रेरित करती हैं। उन्होंने गांधीवाद और मार्क्सवाद के बीच संतुलन बनाते हुए राष्ट्रीय चेतना को मजबूत किया। 1974 में उनका निधन हो गया, किंतु उनकी रचनाएँ आज भी भारतीय साहित्य को गौरवान्वित करती हैं।

ट्रांसफर का ऑर्डर लेकर जब नरेंद्र के पिता अपने परिवार के साथ पटना पहुँचे तो यह नया शहर नरेंद्र के मन को एकदम भा गया। वहां शीघ्र ही एक अच्छे विद्यालय में नरेंद्र को दाखिला मिल गया। परंतु जब नए विद्यालय में नरेंद्र को उसकी कक्षा के विद्यार्थियों ने चिढ़ाना शुरू किया तो उसे बहुत बुरा लगा। नरेंद्र बहुत दुखी लगने लगा।

एक <mark>दिन जब</mark> उसकी माँ ने उससे खुलकर इसका कारण पूछा तो फिर नरेंद्र ने माँ से सभी बातें स्पष्ट बता दीं। वह माँ से यह बताते हुए कि कक्षा के विद्यार्थी उसे चि<mark>ढ़ाते</mark> है और उसे अपने साथ नहीं खेलने नहीं देते है।


he set out with one clear goal: to join a startup in a leadership role and master the fundamentals of running a business.








#### **Holi Celebration**
















"CHAINTANYA SAMAJ"- The mindful living

**BIODIVERSITY AT RISK-OUR CHOICES MATTER** 



The objective of our project was to enhance students' awareness and knowledge about endangered flora and fauna in India, Bangladesh, Thailand, and Sri Lanka. Students conducted in-depth research on five endangered species, including tiger and elephant, and critically endangered fauna and fauna in each country. They investigated causes and effects of species decline and proposed conservation strategies. The findings were creatively presented through brochures featuring bar graphs, pie charts, posters, and slogans. A PowerPoint presentation compiled the collected data, while an MCQ-based assessment, map pointing and PPT presention evaluated student's understanding. oneself about personal finance.









