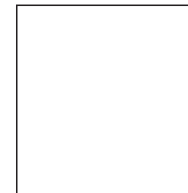

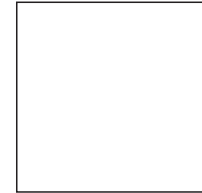

EXPECTATIONS FROM ALL STUDENTS

1. Students should reach the school by 7.20am. If a student is late three times i.e reaches the school by 7.30am, he/she will be sent back home. There will be no entry for students after 7.30 am.
2. Students should always be neatly dressed with properly ironed uniform, polished shoes with proper socks. Boys must have a proper hair cut. Girls should secure hair with black hair pins or bands and should plait the hair if it is below shoulder length. Non adherence to this, will mean that the student will be sent back home to dress up properly.
3. **English must be the only language of communication. Usage of slang language will be strictly dealt with.**
4. Students should make use of dustbins provided for throwing refuse. They are expected to keep the school campus neat and clean.
5. Students should take care of the school property. Damaging school assets, writing on the walls and desks or disfiguring the school property is an offence.
6. Students should not bring expensive articles to the school. The school will not be responsible for the loss of any article or money. **If they bring money for some purpose, it should be handed over to the class teacher in the 1st period.**
7. Students are not allowed to wear chains, expensive gold earrings, fancy ornaments, rings, nail polish or other fancy accessories.
8. Students should not wear watches to school, during the exam time they can wear only analogue watches.
9. Students should keep their vehicles locked, arranged neatly in rows in the parking area allotted to students. The school will not be responsible for any damage or loss of the vehicles. Only driving licence holders can park the vehicles inside the school premises.
10. Students who come to school on the motorised two wheelers must carry their driving license and helmet.
11. Students are allowed to use the school telephone only in case of emergency. (on written permission from the teacher) No student is allowed to bring a mobile to school. If any student is found carrying a mobile with him/her in the class, the mobile will be confiscated and strict action will be taken against him/her.
12. The school as a matter of policy, discourages private tuitions. In case it is absolutely essential, please contact the Principal for discussion.
13. The School expects students to maintain the highest standard of discipline, decorum, punctuality, neatness & responsible behavior both in the class room, outside the premises and during co-curricular activities of the school.
14. Students are answerable to the school authorities for their conduct both in & outside the school. Hence misbehavior in the streets and in public conveyance justifies disciplinary action.
15. Students moving in the corridor and up and down the stairs must walk in SILENCE.

STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

An important goal of New Era Sr. Sec. School is to develop responsible and ethical citizens. The classroom teacher, supported by the principal, establishes an atmosphere of respect for classmates, adults and self, to engender an atmosphere conducive to learning. Self-discipline underlies the whole educational structure. It develops self control, character, orderliness and efficiency; it is the key to good conduct and consideration of others. The school students are required to adhere to a strict code of conduct that does not allow for disrespect of others or disruptive behavior. Inappropriate conduct will be handled through disciplinary channels.

ATTENDANCE :

It is important for students' academic progress that they attend school every day. A student who is absent misses explanations, discussion and classroom activities that cannot be recovered. Therefore all personal trips should be planned during the announced vacation periods; social affairs for weekends and other engagements for after-school hours.

Every student is expected to maintain at least 75% attendance to enable him to go to next class. On joining the school a proper leave application with reasons for the absence must be given in the diary page and also on the ERP. If student was down with a contagious disease, a 'medically fit' certificate must be produced.

Students should maintain proper personal hygiene and cleanliness. They should cut their nails at regular intervals to ensure safety against diseases.

No student is expected to attend classes with contagious disease.

If a student remains absent for more than 15 days without prior permission, his name will be struck off from the school register and the joining of the school will be considered as new admission.

LEAVING THE SCHOOL PREMISES :

Students are not expected to leave during the school hours. Students are not expected to stand outside or loiter around the nearby shopping complex. Leaving campus without proper permission is an offence and is viewed very seriously.

BEHAVIOR :

New Era Sr. Sec. School educates and nurtures children according to the highest standards of academic excellence and responsible behavior. The school strives to help each child develop a strong sense of self-esteem balanced by respect and appreciation for others. Children are expected to participate in creating a kind and supportive community. There are certain behaviors that will not be tolerated within our community :

- ❖ Verbal or physical conduct hurtful to others (including name calling, inappropriate language, severe aggression, harassment)
- ❖ Destruction or vandalism of property
- ❖ Lying, cheating or stealing
- ❖ Leaving campus without an adult

When the school's expectations are not met, classroom teachers will intervene and communicate with parents as necessary. When infractions arise outside the classroom, any staff member may respond. If the inappropriate behavior is particularly harmful or is a repeated infraction, the principal will contact the parents to discuss ways to resolve the situation. Strategies may include:

- ❖ A meeting of the parents and teachers
 - ❖ Sending a student home for the remainder of the day
 - ❖ Loss of certain privileges, such as recess, after-school sports or field trips
- Repeated occurrences are of particular concern because they interfere with the learning process and have a detrimental impact on the rest of the school community. In instances of extremely inappropriate, persistent or disruptive behavior, the administration may take more severe measures, including suspension or expulsion from school.

FOOD ITEMS, TOYS AND ELECTRONIC ITEMS :

Children should not bring electronic devices or toys to school except when asked by the classroom teacher. Personal listening devices and electronic games should be left at home. Cell phones are not allowed in school.

Students are served lunch in the dining hall, however they can bring a small tiffin containing some light nutritious food.

INTENTIONAL DAMAGE TO THE SCHOOL PROPERTY :

For all damages to the furniture and fixtures and deliberate laboratory damage, the students will have to pay the actual cost of the article damaged along with a penalty of 20% of the cost of damaged items. Such damages will mean serious action against the student.

SCHOOL HEALTH & WELLNESS

NESSS believes in holistic care of every student, placing the Counsellor and Special Educator at the forefront of support. Both are highly qualified and experienced professionals who provide personalized guidance and assistance to nurture each child's unique potential.

Our Counseling Cell offers comprehensive guidance to parents, teachers, and students for behavior management and academic support, fostering social and emotional well-being.

Complementing this, our School Health & Wellness program ensures comprehensive student welfare through dedicated committees:

1. POCSSO Committee - protects students' legal and safety rights.
2. Grievance Redressal Committee - addresses bullying and other student concerns.
3. Health & Wellness Committee - oversees overall health initiatives. We believe social and emotional care, facilitated by our counseling

and special education services, plays a crucial role in holistic child development within our school community.

You can meet the Counselor & Special educator with prior appointment booked through school diary/school office as follows:-

1. Grade 1st to 6th - Wednesday /Saturday (9am to 11am)
2. Grade 7th to 12th - Saturday 11:30am to 1:30pm / Monday 2pm to 4pm

MEDICAL AND HEALTH CARE

A nursing staff has been appointed by the school. Parents will be informed of routine medical examination.

Parents must inform the school in writing of any particular medical requirements for their children.

In case of medical emergency, the school will contact the parents on the numbers written in the diary. In the event that a parent cannot be contacted quickly, the school will act in the best interests of the child to obtain the necessary medical attention.

Parents should provide the school with sufficient information about their child's health care needs and treatment. Where necessary, this information should be updated annually or more frequently if there is a change in circumstances.

FEE RULES

FEES :

1. Fees will be paid quarterly and regularly between 1st and 15th of the starting month of a quarter.
2. The mode of payment of fees: A parent needs to log in to <https://www.schoolerpindia.co.in/school/neweraschool/mobileapp/> and enter username and a password [USER NAME is your ward's G R NO. and PASSWORD is Date of Birth in the format of DDMMYYYY (For example if a child is born on 22nd October 1998 then the password is 22101998).
3. If cheques are returned by the bank for any reason a fine of rupees three hundred will be charged in addition to the late fee.

WITHDRAWAL FROM THE SCHOOL :

1. A written notice of at least three weeks must be given for withdrawal from the school.
2. Student refundable deposit, will be refunded at the time of withdrawal of the child from the school on the production of the deposit receipt, provided all school dues have been paid and settled.
3. Refund of Student refundable deposit should be claimed within a year from the date of withdrawal of the child from the school.

USE OF SCHOOL DIARY

This diary is an essential part of your personal equipment as a member of the New Era community. It is to be kept in neat, tidy state all the year round. There should be no graffiti inside or outside the diary. Your daily activities of home work, project, assignment work and revision work are to be entered in the diary. You must bring the diary to the school everyday, failing which you will face punishment.

HOME STUDY POLICY

Each student should have his or her own individual study program that is organised in consultation with parents and the teacher. A study program involves good organisation and self-discipline.

Here is a guide to the minimum amount of time a student should spend each day on homework / study to achieve satisfactory result :

A good program is useless if it is only on paper - it requires **organisation** and **self-discipline** to turn it into **action**.

GUIDELINES FOR THE PARENTS

We, therefore, request parents to help us realise our objectives through their active co-operation and support and by observing the following guidelines :-

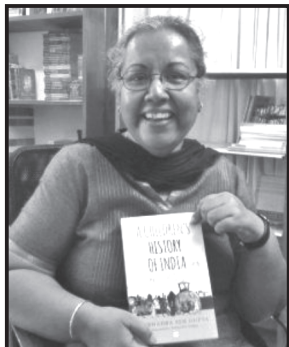
1. Please ensure that the rules and regulations laid down by the school are strictly observed by your child.
2. Encourage your child to develop a sense of responsibility and accountability for her/his actions.
3. Help your child inculcate discipline, neatness, punctuality and environmental awareness. Qualities like honesty, integrity and politeness can be taught through personal examples.
4. Refer to the school diary regularly to keep in touch with your child's progress.
5. Do not visit your child during class hours. Visitors are expected to be only in the reception. In case of emergency the school authorities may be contacted who will then do the needful.
6. Respond positively to the invitations for meetings to discuss your wards' performance.
7. Use the diary to send a leave note, duly signed, for your child's absence from school and inform the school in writing if your child has to remain absent from school.
8. Intimate the class teacher in case of change in address or telephone number.
9. Encourage your child to communicate in English.
10. Encourage your child to be proud of her/his school, cultural heritage and country.
11. Please do not seek permission to take your child home during school hours, even on examination days. Do not send the child to the school if unwell. In case of illness, the school authorities will take care to send the student home.
12. Every student is expected to be present in the school by 7.20 a.m. In no circumstances late comers will be allowed.
13. Parents are requested to keep their children at home who feel feverish or otherwise ill.
14. If the child is taken home after paper and pen test, he/she is marked absent in the attendance register. Hence he/she is not assessed on any work happening on that day.
15. Parents are requested to download the SCHOOL ERP and log in to access all communications from school.
16. The school is committed to sustain environment so we want to go paperless and aim at not sending circulars. Please log in with your username to see all circulars and your ward's progress in the school.
17. In case of any problem parents/guardian may meet the Principal/teachers on the "OPEN DAY" or communicate in the school diary.
18. Please fill up the first two pages of the diary for record purpose. The photo should remain intact on the student's particular page throughout the session.
19. Please do not send your child to school in overcrowded vans/autos.
20. It is best to donate some books to the library to celebrate your ward's birthday. The school strongly says no to distribution of sweets of any kind for health reasons.
21. Help your child to take responsibility of the consequences of his forgetfulness. Please do not request the school office to reach things to your child.

Please go through the school rules and make sure that your ward follows them.

Making History Come Alive for Young Readers

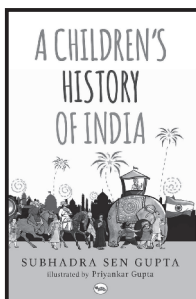

HELP US TO HELP YOU - LIBRARY RULES

The NESSS Junior and Senior Libraries cater to the academic needs of students and teachers. The following rules have been framed for your convenience and smooth functioning of the library:

1. The Junior Library is meant for students of Classes I to V.
2. Students from Class II onwards are permitted to issue books.
3. Parents of Class I students may issue books from the Junior Library on all working Saturdays, from 7:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., starting from the month of June.
4. Interested students may submit a request list of books, which will be considered while purchasing new books for the library.
5. In case a book is lost, it must be replaced with a new copy, or a fine equal to twice the cost of the book will be charged.
6. Fine will be charged if books are found damaged or spoiled due to water. Taking care of library books is everyone's responsibility.
7. If the barcode on a book is found damaged, a fine of ₹20 will be charged.
8. Students of Classes I to VIII may issue only one book at a time.
9. Students of Class IX onwards may issue two books at a time.
10. Students are allowed to carry only their school diary and a library book inside the library.
11. Students are not allowed to wear shoes inside the library.
12. A student may retain a book for a maximum period of two weeks. If the book is not returned within this period, a fine of ₹10 per week will be charged. Delays and repeated late returns will be dealt with strictly.
13. Books will be issued and returned only during designated library periods.
14. Students of Classes I to VIII must return all issued books before the last working day of the academic year (prior to the commencement of annual examinations). Students of Class IX onwards must return books on the last day of their annual examination.
15. All library books must be returned before leaving the school. Transfer Certificates will not be issued until all dues are cleared.
16. Students are permitted to visit the library only during library periods. Special permission to visit at other times may be granted by the librarian.

Abiding by these rules will help us to help you.
